**SUNY Stony Brook University Medical Center**

Stony Brook University Medical Center (SBUMC) is the academic medical center affiliated with the State University of New York at Stony Brook (SUNY) and its medical school. It is the only tertiary care center and Level 1 trauma facility in Long Island's Suffolk County serving a population of over 1.8 M. SBUMC is the regional referral center for trauma, perinatal and neonatal intensive care, burns, bone marrow and stem cell transplantation and is the regional resource center for emergency management. The Medical School trains 450 students annually and there are over 540 residents and fellows working in the Hospital. **Stony Brook Long Island Children's Hospital**

The **Stony Brook Children's Hospital** was established in June, 2010 and became a member of the National Association of Children's Hospitals and Related Institutions (NACHRI). [www.stonybrookchildrens.org](http://www.stonybrookchildrens.org) It is a 100 bed tertiary care pediatric facility that is a "hospital within a hospital" with more than 100 pediatric physicians in 30 different specialties. **Stony Brook Children's Hospital** is the only dedicated children's program west of the Nassau/Queens border. The Hospital has nationally renowned physicians, other clinicians and researchers, and specialized facilities – all part of a university based children's hospital on Long Island. The development of a new children's hospital facility is a top priority for the SBUMC and Medical School and fundraising for the new hospital is underway.

The Pediatric Department continues to grow and add new faculty and leadership positions. Progress continues with the current facility to add and improve the facilities for Pediatric Care. The opening of the **new Pediatric Emergency Department** was celebrated in April 2010 along with the appointment of a nationally known Chief of the Division of Pediatric Emergency Medicine. As a measure of its strong support for Pediatrics, SBUMC has built a new newborn nursery. The new Level III NICU will be completed next year and will be the most advanced NICU in New York.

## **The Department of Pediatrics**

The Department is a vibrant and collegial environment led by energetic Chair and Physician-in-Chief of Stony Brook Children's Hospital, Margaret McGovern, MD, PhD. The Department includes 13 Divisions and more than 80 full time faculty members. It offers a categorical pediatrics residency program as well as a combined Pediatrics Medicine residency that together train over 50 residents. There are five accredited fellowship training programs. The Division of Emergency Medicine will establish a fellowship training program in Emergency Medicine scheduled to begin in 2012.

## **Assistant Director of Pediatric Emergency Medicine**

With a new Pediatric Emergency Department, Stony Brook Children's offers children and families dedicated space. The Emergency Department has the most advanced technology and diagnostics, including a 320 slice CT scanner and the full range of equipment needed in a pediatric ER.

The Department has recruited four PEM fellowship trained physicians and is actively recruiting additional staff to the faculty as patient visits continue to grow. The current faculty is a collaborative group and enjoys working together in a new program. The annualized volume of visits has grown from 21,000 last year to 30,000 this year and the volume is growing.

The best candidate for the Assistant Director will be a skilled emergency medicine physician on an academic career track seeking a leadership position in Emergency Medicine or teaching/research/administrative responsibilities in the Department of Pediatrics. The Assistant Director will play a major role in mentoring the PEM faculty and teaching residents. Some of the opportunities for mentoring and faculty career development include participating in: the planning and administration of the PEM fellowship program; clinical operations; EMS; research in the Division or in the Department of Pediatrics; community outreach; and clinical simulation.

Candidates will be physicians who have completed an accredited Pediatric Emergency Fellowship training program, have 3-5 years of clinical practice experience and are board certified in Pediatric Emergency Medicine.

## **Compensation and Licensure**

Compensation and benefits are very competitive, including generous employer contributions to the 401k and a New York State retirement program. A New York State medical license or eligibility for a New York State license is required.
